Course Description:

It will give the ability to make important decisions independently but also the capacity to influence others' decisions. The topics explored will help students to become better decision-makers in students professional life and beyond. Through engaging case studies, discussion, and exercises students will learn decision-making techniques, and how can influence the smarter decision for you and your organization.

Course Goals: The main purpose is to learn students the fundamental lessons of decision-making and to show how they can apply this knowledge to their lives. At the end of the Decision-making course, students will be able to:

- Explore how problem-solving and decision-making interrelate.
- Explore decision types and their difference from outcomes
- Introduce a range of problem-solving and decision-making tools.
- Offers techniques for methodically evaluating choices
- Have greater insight into decision-making processes
- Use that insight to make more effective decisions and understand how to make decisions as a team.
- Possess a range of different perspectives on what counts as an effective decision
- Be better equipped to understand and influence the decision-making processes of other individuals and groups
- Understand better how people perceive and decide about risk

Course Assessment:
