Course Title: Project Management

Course Credits: 4

Language of Instruction: Albanian

Course Description: The subject is based not only on the literature and practice of developed countries in the first place, the USA, but also on the legislation and practice of Albania. In this subject, the use of instruments for the preparation of investment projects is treated in a clear language.

Course Goals: The purpose of the subject Project Management is to build a framework of general knowledge about project management, the importance of obtaining a range of knowledge from this field today in global economic development and to achieve that this knowledge can be implemented in professional life in the future.

The objective of the subject is that the student will be able to understand and use the progress of the practices learned through all the phases of a project, apply the fields of project management. Expected learning outcomes:

Student benefits After completing this course, the student will demonstrate the following competencies: 1. Competence on the need for project management 2. Ability to define what a project is and explain the dependencies between areas, knowledge and process groups 3. Explain the basic concepts of project management 4. Gather requirements and develop a plan for a simple project 5. Competence to manage, track and report the status of a simple project 6. Analyze the result of a simple project and develop the lessons learned 7. Initiate, scope, and plan a project and develop a project schedule 8. Determine the cost of the project and obtain resources 9. Control project changes and manage project risk 10. Execute and close a project 11. Use software packages to apply to the plan.

Course Requirements: Every student is encouraged to be active in the seminars and to follow the lessons. The frequency of 75% of the seminars is obligatory.

Grading: The final grade is composed by:

Participation and activation in seminars	10 points (10%)
Coursework in team	10 points (10%)
Final exam (paper based)	80 points (80%)
