

## **Sample Course Description**

**Course Title: Tourism laws**

**Course Credits: 7**

**Language of Instruction: Albanian/English**

**Course Description:** The course includes the simultaneous treatment of the principles of civil law in general and ownership rights. It will offer theoretical and practical knowledge on property law issues, contractual law issues in field of civil law and specifically tourism law. The course aims to develop the students' awareness on the implementation and legal framework in the respective fields. Students will have the opportunity to solve the tasks required in the field of tourism law with a logical and analytical approach. Students will develop skills and a critical approach to the law and legal argumentation in the field of property law and in the field of contract law.

**Course Goals:** The key goals are on definitions and classification of rights; legal-civil relationship, legal entities, legal entities and commercial companies; special institutes of civil law, tourism framework, representation and legal actions; contracts and negotiation method, shortcomings and possible improvements in the tourism law etc.

**Course Requirements:** 75% of the seminar hours are mandatory. Evaluation during the course is based on oral control of the knowledge as well on case law presented during the course.

**Grading:** 20% of the overall evaluation (100%) will be given on oral seminar control. These evaluations will be added to the final exam, which will take place through the written form and will take 80% of the overall evaluation.

**Course Schedule:** This course takes place in the first semester of the second academic year. The course lasts 15 weeks, where for each week there are two hours of lectures and three hours of seminars (In total 30 hours of lectures and 45 hours of seminars).
