Course Title: English Grammar, Morphology

Course Credits: 6

Language of Instruction: English

Course Description: This course is organized in lectures and seminars. The first part of the course aims at providing students with theoretical and practical knowledge about parts of speech. They learn how to identify parts of speech in context. In the second part, word formation of the English language, students get information about the processes of word formation in the English language and learn to distinguish them, identify parts of a word and learn how to form new meaningful words out of roots, prefixes and suffixes.

Course Goals: This subject aims to equip students with theoretical and practical knowledge on the types and structure of the English words. Students will be able to identify word-classes (noun, verb, adjective...etc.), the processes of word formation in the English language and the parts of a word (morphemes, root, prefix, suffix, inflections...etc).

Course Requirements: The assessments which contribute to course score include attendance 75%, participation, assignment, mid-term exams and the final exam.

Grading: A final course grade will be the sum total of the points allocated to each completed requirement. Point distribution is indicated to the students at the beginning of the course.
