**Course Title: English Grammar, Syntax**

**Course Credits: 6**

**Language of Instruction: English**

**Course Description:** This course is organized in lectures and seminars. The lecture classes are intended to offer students theoretical information on the elements of the sentence and the way they are arranged in a sentence to provide meaning. It gives information on the types of the simple sentences and the different communicative functions they correlate to. It also gives students information on the different classes of sentences classified according to their structure and the meaning they provide. Theoretical information is applied in the seminar classes. Students are expected to be able to identify and analyze elements and phrases in sentences and construct different structurally and semantically correct sentences.

**Course Goals:** This subject aims to equip students with theoretical and practical knowledge on the structure of the English language. Students will be able to form properly structured simple sentences, compound sentences, complex sentences and compound complex sentences and use them properly in their daily discourse.

**Course Requirements:** The assessments which contribute to course score include attendance participation, assignment, mid-term exams and the final exam.

**Grading:** A final course grade will be the sum total of the points allocated to each completed requirement. Point distribution is indicated to the students at the beginning of the course.

**Course frequency:** 2 fifty-minute lecture classes and 2 fifty-minute seminar classes per week.
